

## **Compound subjects and predicates**

Circle the subjects. <u>Underline</u> the predicates. A **compound subject** is when a sentence has two or more subjects that share the same verb. *Aiden and Jerry ran to the store.* 

A **compound predicate** is when a sentence has two or more verbs that share the same subject. Sammie walked to the park and played on the swings.
