to beat; defeat

dress

to put clothing on

She dressed her baby in warm clothes.





dress

RE

a one-piece garment for a woman or girl that covers the body and extends down over the legs

Natalie is wearing a beautiful blue dress.



dress

clothing of a specified kind for men or women

The folk dancers wore traditional dress.

to decorate

We dressed the windows with curtains.



dress

to clean or put a bandage on; treat

The nurse dressed the cut on the patient's leg.



dress

to prepare for cooking

He dressed the roast before putting it in the oven.



eye

the organ of the body that gives us sight

My brother has blue eyes.

free from rain, snow, and storms; clear

The weather was fair today and made for a lovely hike in the woods.

average; acceptable

Your grades are fair, but I'm sure you can do better.





fair

of a light tone

I have fair skin and have to be careful in the sun.





fair

in a just manner; fairly

The kids played fair in the playground.





file

a folder or box for holding loose papers that are typically arranged in a particular order

Mom puts all her bills in a file for safekeeping.





| file | the papers or other objects that are so kept Doctors keep files on their patients. |

| file | a line of things or people standing in order The kids walked in single file down the corridor. |
| file | to store in a file The librarian filed the reports in alphabetical order. |
| file | to present, hand in, or send My parents have to file a tax return every year. |

KE

file

a long, thin steel tool with ridges on its surface for shaping and smooth down metal or wood

Use that file to smooth the corners of your cutting board.



PRE

file

to shape, smooth, or grind down with a file or other tool

Mom files her fingernails.



PRE

foot

the end part of the leg of humans and other animals, on which the body stands and walks

In soccer you kick the ball with your foot.

the part of something that is lowest

My dog sleeps at the foot of my bed.



foot

a unit of length equal to twelve inches

My brother eats a sandwich that's a foot long.





foot

pay the bill for something

My uncle is footing the bill for the whole family at the restaurant.








to move through the air by means of wings

| fly | move or be hurled quickly through the air A ball flew over the hedge into our yard. |

| fly | a flying insect with a pair of transparent wings I can hear a fly buzzing nearby. |
| gun | a sticky substance that is given off by certain plants Acacia trees give off a natural gum called gum Arabic. |

gum

chewing gum

gum

to smear or stick together with gum

He gummed the envelope and sealed it.





to clog

hard

hard

in a harsh or severe way

asking for a great effort; strict; demanding

with great force or strength

It rained really hard this morning.
