hide

to put or hold out of sight; keep from view

I saw my mother hide the cake.



hide

to keep as a secret

She hid the truth from her brother.



CRE

hide

to make or keep oneself out of view

I'm hiding in the closet.



RE

hide

the skin of one of the larger animals such as a buffalo or cow

The pale gray-brown fur of the puma helps this big cat hide in the jungle.







hit	to give a blow or stroke to; strike She hit the ground with her stick.
hit	to come in contact with The pebble hit the window.
hit	to drive or send by striking He hit the baseball with a bat.
	to reach or get to
hit	The car hit its top speed.



hit	to have a strong effect on When Fred left our school it hit me hard.
hit	a blow or stroke The boxer took many hits in the match.
hit	someone or something that is very popular The band had three top hits this year.
jam	to force or pack tightly into a small space She jammed her clothes into her luggage.

jam

to push suddenly and with force

She jammed her foot on the brake.



jam

to fill up or block

Ice jammed up the river causing it to overflow.





jam

to hurt by strong, sudden pressure

Cassie jammed her finger in the door.



jam

to be blocked or not work properly

Sue's bike brake jammed, but luckily she did not fall off.

to play or improvise music with others

The band jammed for hours.



jam

a difficult or embarrassing situation; trouble

Paul was in a jam at school.





a large gathering or mass that slows or stops movement

We were stuck in the traffic jam for three hours this afternoon.



jam

a sweet spread made by cooking crushed fruit and sugar

I put strawberry jam on my toast in the morning.

coming after or finishing behind all others

She spoke last at the meeting.

last

coming just before the present time; the most recent: latest

Last night we saw a beautiful sunset.





last

being the only one left

This is your last chance.





last

after all others

Nate's last name starts with 'z', so his name appears last on the class list.

most recently in time

When did you last see your grandmother?



last

a person or thing that is last

Matt stands last in line.

last

the final mention or sight

You've not seen the last of me.



RE

last

to go on through time; continue

The concert lasted for two hours.

to stay in good condition

My bike lasted for a long time.

last

to remain in good supply

Our Halloween candy lasted until February.





left

on, toward, or relating to the side of a human body or of a thing that is to the west

My mom is left-handed, which means she writes with her left hand.





left

relating to a person or group favoring liberal, socialist views

Left-wing people have political ideas that are based on socialism.

He looked to the left, then the right and then crossed the street.

went away from or departed

We left for Hawaii this morning.





left

let remain

We left the book at the library.

left

let stay without bothering or changing

We left him alone.







left	let stay for action or for later decision We left the discussion to the next morning.
lie	an untrue statement made on purpose We told a lie to the teacher, because we didn't want to get into trouble.
lie	to make a false statement on purpose Tommy lied to his father.
lie	to be in or place oneself in a flat or resting position I like to lie on the sofa for my rest.



lie	to rest or remain, as, on, or under a surface The book lies open on the table.
lie	to be located The house lies to the east of town.
lie	to be placed; exist The responsibility lies with Tommy.
mean	to have as a goal or purpose; intend I mean to finish as I started.

miss

to fail to see, hear, or understand

My brother missed what mother said.



miss

to fail to perform, attend, or otherwise experience

I missed the soccer game.

to fail to do or get

She missed her chance at winning the tournament.



miss

to avoid or escape

The motorbike missed the tree.



miss

to feel sad or lonely without

I miss my friend.





miss

a failure to hit or catch something

She knit four socks in a row before a miss.

We missed the salt and the soup tastes bland.



miss

the title used before the name of a girl or woman who is not married

Our teachers is called Miss Black.

nail

a small metal spike with a broadened flat head, driven typically into wood with a hammer

nail

a hard growth at the end of a finger or toe

Your nails are getting long, time to clip them.

on top of, so as to cover

over

throughout; across

over

on the subject of

We argued over whose turn it was to take out the garbage.



over

across a space

We will sail over to Africa.

so as to cover

There is icing sugar all over this cake.

over

to the side

Move over, please.

across the edge of and down

The sauce is boiling over.
