



Joining Two Sentences with "but"

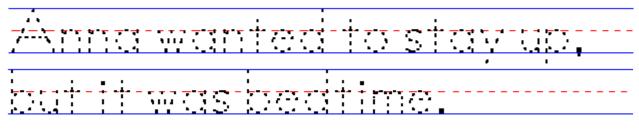
Good writers use short and long sentences. You can join two shorter sentences by using a comma and the word "but". **The word "but" is used to compare and contrast.**

Examples: It was time to get up. I was tired. (It was time to get up, but I was tired.)

It was raining. I didn't bring an umbrella. (It was raining, but I didn't bring an umbrella.)
