


## Which Number is Greater?

1. The pictures have ten-sticks and one-dots. Fill in the missing parts. Then circle the number that is **more**.



Study the above pictures. Do we first check how many TENS the numbers have or how many ONES the numbers have?

- Check first how many \_\_\_\_\_ the numbers have.
- If the numbers have the same amount of \_\_\_\_\_, then compare the \_\_\_\_\_

## For example:

- 92 has more TENS than 89, so 92 is greater than 89.
- 62 has the same amount of TENS as 66, but it has less ONES than 66. Therefore 62 is less than 66.

The symbol > means "greater than", and < means "less than". Think of it as a hungry alligator's mouth! The open end (the open "mouth") of the symbol ALWAYS points to the **bigger** number—the alligator wants to eat as much as it can!

For example:

3 < 5 14 > 3 60 > 50 48 < 99

7 < 17
