- 4. John rode his bike to school. He did not secure it to the rack. (but) John rode his bike to school, but he did not secure it to the rack.
- 5. Martha likes chocolate. She doesn't like candies. (but) Martha likes chocolate, but she doesn't like candies.
- The students were sitting on the carpet. They were listening to the teacher. (and)
