- 5. You should sharpen your skates. Dull blades do not let you skate well. (*for*) You should sharpen your skates, **for** dull blades do not let you skate well.
- 6. They wash their hands often. They do not get sick. (*and*) They wash their hands often, **and** they do not get sick.
- 7. There is no baseball on TV tonight. Let's watch a movie instead. (*so*) There is no baseball on TV tonight, **so** let's watch a movie instead.
- 8. Alicia would like to go skiing. She is afraid of falling. (*but*) Alicia would like to go skiing, **but** she is afraid of falling.
- 9. Do you want to play cards? Do you prefer a board game? (*or*) Do you want to play cards, **or** do you prefer a board game?
- 10. Lucas reads a lot. He is not good at spelling. (*yet*) Lucas reads a lot, **yet** he is not good at spelling.
