- 3. You could put your hair up in a bun. You could tie it in pigtails. (*or*) You could put your hair up in a bun, or you could tie it in pigtails.
- Next summer, we could visit Florida. We could go to the Grand Canyon. (*or*) <u>Next summer, we could visit Florida, or we could go to the Grand</u> <u>Canyon.</u>
- Melanie bought cookies at the store. She put them away in the cupboard. (*and*)
 Melanie bought cookies at the store, and she put them away in the cupboard.
- My uncle would like to fly planes. He is afraid of heights. (*but*)
 My uncle would like to fly planes, but he is afraid of heights.
