**No, he would not like to go to dinner tonight.**

**Yes, we will stop by the library on our way to the game.**
3. Can we have cake for dessert? *(no)*  
**No, we cannot have cake for dessert.**
4. Have we ever visited Seattle? *(yes)*  
**Yes, we have visited Seattle.**
5. Did she lose her phone? *(no)*  
**No, she didn't lose her phone.**
6. Do you wake up early on the weekends? *(no)*  
**No, I do not wake up early on the weekends.**
7. Could you please pass me the salt? *(yes)*  
**Yes, I could pass you the salt.**
8. Is this your backpack? *(yes)*  
**Yes, this is my backpack.**
