

## Story elements: Characters

### Grade 2 Comprehension Worksheet

**Character traits** are words that tell us what a character is like on the inside and the outside. They help us understand who they are.

### Read the story and think about the character's traits:

Eli was always a great person to have around, and he was always thinking of good ideas. At recess, the ball got stuck in a tree. Everyone tried to jump and reach it, but no one could. Eli stepped up, got on his tiptoes and stretched his long arms.

“Got it!” he said, tossing the ball down.

His friends cheered, “Eli saves the day!”

Back in class, the teacher asked a tricky math question. The room was quiet until Eli raised his hand.

“What if we add first and then subtract?” he said.

The teacher smiled. “Great thinking, Eli!”

Later, at lunch, Eli had his friends laughing the whole time. He walked like a penguin when he went to throw something away. It made his friends all giggle!
