Drawing conclusions means figuring something out for yourself. To draw conclusions, you need to think about <u>what makes the most sense</u>.

Put a ✓ next to the conclusion that makes the most sense.

1.	Pablo put his pajamas and his toothbrush in his backpack. This probably means that:

2.	Cassie ordered macaroni and cheese and a glass of milk. This probably means that:

4.	The farmer put on his sun hat and placed the tractor keys in his pocket. This probably means that:
	The farmer is going to go to work in the field. The farmer is going to the grocery store in town. The farmer is going to the movies.
5.	Riley's dad turned on the grill and put on a big apron. This probably means that:
	Riley's dad is going to take a nap! Riley's dad is going to barbecue! Riley's dad is working in his office.
6.	Andrew was surprised when the man on the stage pulled a rabbit out of his big black hat. This probably means that:
