Grade 2 Comprehension Worksheet

The **plot** is all the action that happens in a story, from the beginning all the way to the end.
It usually includes a **problem** and a **solution**!

A **problem** is what goes wrong in the story.

A **solution** is how the problem is fixed or solved.

Read the story.

Miss Smith's class was excited. Today, they were having a picnic outside for lunch! After that, they would get to play until it was time to go home. This was their reward for reading 100 books!

Everyone grabbed their lunches and lined up to go outside. As they walked down the hallway to the field, they heard a big clap of thunder! They looked out the window just as it started pouring.

"Oh no!" the students cried. "What are we going to do now? Today was supposed to be special!"

Thankfully, Miss Smith had an idea. She led the class back to their classroom. She asked the students to help move all the desks to the side. Then she put on some music and said, "We can still have a picnic in the classroom!" The students ate their lunches on the floor together.

After lunch, Miss Smith brought out all the games and set them up around the classroom. The students had free time for the rest of the afternoon. They could play, read or draw as much as they wanted. It wasn't quite the same as being outside, but everyone still had a great time!
