Read the story and think about setting:

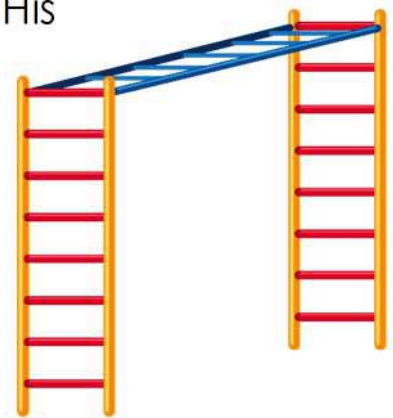
