Grade 2 Comprehension Worksheet

The **setting** is where the story takes place. Sometimes, the author tells you the setting. Sometimes, you have to use clues from the story to guess the setting.

Read the story and think about setting:

Matt's dad grabbed a shopping cart. It made a rattling sound as he pushed it inside. Matt held onto the side of the cart, trying to keep up with his dad's long steps.


