

Cause and effect

Grade 3 Reading Worksheet

The **cause** is <u>why</u> something happened.

The **effect** is <u>what</u> happened.

For example:

Myra couldn't fall asleep last night.

For example:

Myra is very tired today.

1. Read the story once and think about cause and effect:

Her brother's eyes widened. "Whoa! That brownie actually worked!"


"Worked?!" Maya's voice boomed through the house.
