Below is the beginning of an essay about **astronomy**. Read the essay's introduction and three body paragraphs. Then write the essay's conclusion.

A **conclusion paragraph** should summarize your essay's main points and end with a creative or impactful sentence that wraps up your essay!

## Introduction:

Did you ever wish upon a shooting star? The universe is huge, with countless stars and galaxies. I believe more kids should be interested in astronomy. Astronomy expands a child's perspective of the universe. It also promotes curiosity. In addition, it introduces kids to the exciting world of space exploration.

#### Body Paragraph #1:

One reason why kids should get into astronomy is because it makes you see the universe in a whole new way. Page 7 of <u>The Universe</u> states: "Looking through a telescope can make you feel tiny." This means that when kids start exploring astronomy, they begin to understand how big the universe really is and find out there's so much more than just our planet Earth.

#### Body Paragraph #2:

### Body Paragraph #3:
