

## Writing dialogue

**Grade 5 Punctuation Worksheet** 

When writing a dialogue, remember:

- 1. Use quotation marks before and after the speaker's words.
- 2. Use a comma to separate what the speaker said from the rest of the sentence.
- 3. Start a new paragraph when switching speakers.
- 4. Don't always use "said". Other possible words include: exclaimed, explained, muttered, whispered, grumbled, yelled, shouted, replied, stated, and asked.

Imagine the following scene and write dialogue for it. It's okay if some parts are not dialogue but the majority should be!

<u>Scene:</u> During a field trip to the local zoo, three friends accidentally get locked in the parrot exhibit.
